#### The Forward! Into the Breach 7-Week Seminar

*Forward!* Into the Breach is a Compendium Workbook to '*Into the Breach*', an Apostolic Exhortation to Catholic Men, written by Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted of the Diocese of Phoenix. Suitable for both personal use and group settings, the Workbook contains the entire text of Bishop Olmsted's document, 41 questions associated with each section of the Apostolic Exhortation, and 31 interspersed text boxes throughout that seek to further express the faith of the Roman Catholic church relevant to topics addressed in the Bishop's Letter. This 7-week Leadership Seminar for Men is based on the *Forward!* Into the Breach Compendium Workbook.

In this Seminar Guide the entire Workbook has been divided into equal parts for each of the 7-weeks. However, in order to accommodate a 90 minute once a week meeting schedule, it is not feasible to cover all of the Workbook material in just a short weekly presentation overview. With this in mind, each session will open with content and corresponding salient questions that will be most helpful to attendees providing as much insight into the Bishop's Apostolic Exhortation as possible. Therefore, each attendee is encouraged to review the Workbook material and complete the Suggested Discussion Questions before each week's meeting.

#### Discerning How God is Calling You to Step Into the Breach

There are many areas in the Bishop's Apostolic Exhortation for catholic men to ponder and respond to. However, a key goal for the 7-week Seminar is for each attendee to gain additional clarity of purpose as a man created in the image and likeness of God. A purpose that is discerned as his mission given to him by Jesus Christ Himself because of who he is as a man created by God. By the end of the Seminar, each attendee will have the opportunity to identify what he must do to establish and moreover, maintain a firm foundation in the perfect masculine role model for all men, Christ. From there he can more readily and actively acquire from the Holy Spirit the **boldness** and **confidence** to move forward into his calling and mission as the Bishop encourages all of us to, step *Into the Breach*.

To accommodate this goal, each session contains Action Plan Items. These are questions and statements meant to provoke and challenge our thoughts in what God's mission is for each of us as men. As a further aid on page 10 of this Seminar Guide are some areas that are common to all Christians in discerning God's will for our lives. Make no mistake about it, God has a plan for YOUR life, and part of life's joy is to continually seek His will and live it out. Because it is there that you will find no better place to be.

#### The Absolute Need for Brotherhood

The most effective way to live as a man of God is to live in fraternity and fellowship with other Godly men. This is more than a casual friendship, more than a social outreach, more than meeting and greeting acquaintances regardless of the frequency of such. This is a band of brothers supporting each other, listening to each other, praying with and for each other. When placed in its proper order in accordance with a man's vocation in life, this serves not to supplant, but strengthen his vocation and solidify his dedication to his wife and family if called to marriage, or his service to the church and the local Body of Christ if called to Holy Orders, or as a single man.

This is <u>not</u> optional. It has become increasingly clear that the deceiver, Satan, wants nothing more than to isolate men. Isolate them from the ones they love, from the church, and most of all from being a brother in Christ with other men. Many men know this from experience. Today men need to band together, regardless of who we like, dislike, admire, or completely dismiss. We need to see the beyond the personality of the man who God has put in our path to associate with, lead, guide, follow or do whatever our call is with the person. In these men we must see Christ. Seeing Christ in our brothers knocks down walls of division, derision, and dissolution and brings unity to the Body of Christ.

## A Different Kind of Warfare

In Christ we become spiritual warriors. Warriors who lift high His cross. Warriors who follow the Lord and His church on earth into battle for our souls, the souls of those who we love and care for, and indeed the world. Participation in this battle is not altogether daunting to contemplate. Because as we will see, it is living out who we are. Men. Men fighting together on the side of righteousness and truth. This is not a militaristic campaign of destruction. No, it is a self-sacrificing service of carrying God's love and truth to those who are deceived by sin, Satan, and the world. As St. Paul tells us:

"...we do not corrupt the word of God; but make known the truth, we commend ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. And if our gospel is ... veiled, it is veiled only to those who are perishing. In their case, the god of this world has blinded their unbelieving minds, that they should not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. For we preach not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord..." (2 Corinthians 4:3-5 Challoner-Rheims Version).

- ✓ Discernment is a key aspect in the spiritual battle for men. Discernment in seeing how Satan distorts masculinity. Meditating on this quote from Bishop Olmsted is an important way to comprehend the truth of what it means to be a man. "Satan's primary strategy is to damage and abolish human fatherhood, in the man is a relationship where each of us first glimpses what God's fatherhood might be like." (p.61)
- ✓ How will I live out my call to Fatherhood within my vocation?

#### Discerning God's Will

In discerning God's will for our lives, there are multiple aspects to take into consideration. First, don't go it alone. Seek the guidance of someone you trust and respect in spiritual matters. As you progress in your discernment, check in with them so you have the benefit of an objective third-party viewpoint.

Second is prayer. We must pray regularly asking God what it is He wishes from us, and then listen. Listen a lot. Be in His presence in Eucharistic adoration if possible, or in front of the tabernacle at church and listen in our heart. Listen to His word in scripture. Read through the life of Jesus in the Gospels, the early church in the Acts of the Apostles, the epistles, and listen. Listen to others who God has placed in your life.

Once you have a sense of your discernment, ask yourself some questions. Is it appropriate to my state in life? Does what you are discerning align with church teaching? Does it feel right? Does it bring conflict or peace? Are you seeing signs of God's providence? Sometimes the Lord will bring us some remarkable signs. For example, have doors just opened for you to move forward with the idea? Have people come up to you and mentioned the same thing? All of these are factors for consideration. As you begin to step *Into the Breach* look for a sure sign of doing God's will, fruit. Does it bring fruit to the lives of those you encounter? Does it bring fruit to you, your family, the church? Keep in mind that sometimes the fruit isn't automatically evident, but does indeed appear. Doing something new is sometimes not so easy and doesn't always go the right way at first. But does it bring love, joy, and peace? If it doesn't bring peace and/or fruit, care should be taken to reassess your discernment. This is where frequent contact with a third-party can be especially helpful.
